

Currency (Royal Australian Mint) Determination 2008 (No. 9)¹

Currency Act 1965

I, NICK SHERRY, Minister for Superannuation and Corporate Law, make this Determination under paragraph 13 (2) (b) and subsection 13A (1) of the *Currency Act* 1965.

1 Name of Determination

This Determination is the *Currency (Royal Australian Mint) Determination* 2008 (No. 9).

2 Commencement

This Determination commences on the day after it is registered.

3 Definition

In this Determination:

Act means the Currency Act 1965.

4 Coin denomination and standard composition

- (1) For paragraph 13 (2) (b) of the Act, the Act has effect, on and after the day on which this Determination commences, as if:
 - (a) there were included in the Schedule to the Act, a reference to the denomination 'Fifty cents' and there were specified in the Schedule, opposite that denomination, the standard composition 'not less than 99.99% gold' as the standard composition of coins of that denomination; and
 - (b) there were included in the Schedule to the Act, a reference to the denomination 'One dollar' and there were specified in the Schedule, opposite that denomination, the standard composition 'not less than 99.99% gold' as the standard composition of coins of that denomination.
- (2) Subsection (1) does not affect any other determination made under paragraph 13 (2) (b) of the Act.

5 Specification of coins

For subsection 13A (1) of the Act, each item in Schedule 1 specifies, for a coin having the denomination and standard composition mentioned in the item:

- (a) the coin's standard weight; and
- (b) the allowable variation from that standard weight; and
- (c) the coin's dimensions; and
- (d) the coin's design.

6 Application of Determination

The specifications in Schedule 1 do not affect any other determination of the specifications of a coin.

Obverse design An effigy of Queen Elizabeth II, and the initials 'IRB', surrounded by the inscriptions:

(a) 'ELIZABETH II'; and

(b) 'AUSTRALIA 2009'; and

(c) '1 DOLLAR'.

Reverse design A design consisting of:

(a) a representation of:

(i) a bounding kangaroo and its shadow; and

(ii) the sun; and

(iii) a line; and

(b) the inscriptions:

(i) '1 oz. Fine silver'; and

(ii) 'F12' enclosed within a circle; and

(iii) 'WP'.

Obverse design An effigy of a young Queen Elizabeth II, surrounded by the inscriptions:

(a) 'ELIZABETH II'; and

(b) 'AUSTRALIA 2009'.

Reverse design A design consisting of a representation of the Australian Coat of Arms and the

inscription '50' superimposed over a background swirl design.

Item 3 \$1 coin

Denomination \$1

Standard composition Not less than 99.99% gold

Standard weight and allowable variation

 $21.70 \text{ g} \pm 0.18 \text{ g}$

Maximum diameter25.12 mmMaximum thickness2.80 mm

Shape Circular

Edge Interrupted milling

Obverse design An effigy of a young Queen Elizabeth II, surrounded by the inscriptions:

(a) 'ELIZABETH II'; and

(b) 'AUSTRALIA 2009'.

Reverse design A design consisting of:

(a) a representation of 5 bounding kangaroos in a circular pattern; and

(b) the inscription '1 DOLLAR' superimposed over the representation of the kangaroos.
